NEWSLETTER AUGUST 2001

Good News! We feel that the time is right to resume mounted club activities, subject, of course, to no deterioration in the FMD situation .

There have been no FMD outbreaks south of the Severn / Wash line since the 17th June and Devon, severely hit by FMD, was declared disease free on 1st August. The lack of information, on television and in our daily papers, lead many people to believe that the FMD is over. There are still daily outbreaks of the disease in the North and the Brecon Beacons, although the daily tally is reducing and has been in single figures for some time. Recent FMD cases in Hexham, Northumberland, after a gap of three months, is a cause of concern. Strict bio-security measures are still demanded by DEFRA (MAFF). There are large inconsistencies in the interpretation of this dictat. Disinfecting procedures are being implemented to a lesser or greater extent at current shows. Some venues seem to disinfect one week and not the next. Other attempts are laughable, or vary according to the length of the entrance queue. This all leaves us rather confused about which guidelines we should follow.

The BRC committee have sanctioned National qualifying competitions and finals to recommence.

BRC Hunter Trials Championships that had been provisionally rescheduled for 30th September has now been cancelled.

The BVRC committee have decided that we can run events, without disinfecting, at certain controlled venues. The plan is to resume instruction as soon as possible, to run a Dressage and Show Jumping Show on the 30th September in place of the one we missed on 2nd September, and run our Hunter Trial, as planned (disinfecting if it is still necessary), on the 4th November.

I apologise if we haven't kept you informed as often as we might, but we were hanging on hoping that the situation would improve. Our attempts at organising non-mounted socials events largely fell on stony ground, which was disappointing, but we live and learn.

ALL MEMBERS PLEASE NOTE: COMPETITION RULE CHANGES

Although we haven't run any competitions this year, there have been **a few rule changes** introduced into the BRC Rule Book, which came into effect on 1st May 2001. These rules will apply to any inter Riding Club Competitions that are held. We may use our discretion as to which of these we introduce into our own club competitions. Please read any schedule rules carefully to see which apply.

Some of these changes may come as a bit of a shock for those of us who haven't competed for a while.

One Day Event & Hunter Trial Rules

A Class 3 (Purple Label) Body Protector is obligatory for Cross Country competitions.

(It is recommended that body protectors be worn outside clothing.)

Medical armbands are compulsory for cross-country events (Armbands issued by BE and BRC are acceptable)

Watches capable of being started, stopped and recording time elapsed are forbidden for any Cross Country.

Fall of Horse on the Cross Country will invoke automatic retirement.

Show Jumping Rules

In Show Jumping, under BSJA rules, adopted by BRC, a new faults system has been introduced for Show Jumping disobediences (refusals etc.).

1st Disobedience incurs 4 faults

2nd Disobedience incurs Elimination

A refusal with a knockdown incurs a 4 second time penalty.

Dressage & Show Jumping Show at Knighton Down, Larkhill on Sunday 30th September (schedule enclosed).

Due to the success of last year's Dressage and Show Jumping Show at Blackburn Farm, Grateley, we will be trying the same format again in late September. A show incorporating both disciplines (separately not together) will be run Knighton Down, Larkhill. Due to FMD it will cost more both financially and in effort to put on the show and would appreciate your support. There are plenty of classes to choose from. Come along and have a go. Jemma is organising this show. We are all a bit rusty after our layoff, please give her plenty of offers of help, setting up the day before and on the day. Fence judges are always in short supply so volunteers are very welcome. Fences need to be manned from 9.30am to 4pm. We usually allocate people in two stints allowing helpers to opt for morning or afternoon, but even if you can only manage a couple of hours this would be very useful. All the General instruction sessions consist of a some flatwork with some optional gridwork or a small course of jumps at the end. Each session will last 1 hour 30 minutes. Groups of 4-6 people.

The instruction is aimed at all levels of horse and rider - do come and have a go. If there is more than 1 group, please ring 2 days beforehand to find out to which group you have been allocated.

Area 17 Hunter Novice & Open Hunter Trials Team Qualifier.

Area 17 have got organised this year and are holding qualifying competitions for the National RC Hunter Trials Championships, scheduled to run in April 2002. The Novice qualifying competition will be held in the Spring at Dene Farm, Nether Wallop, and we are hosting the Open qualifier with our own Hunter Trial on the 4th November 2001.

Enclosed with this newsletter is an application form for Open team places. If you wish to be considered, please fill in the form and return it to Sam Mawer, by the **1st October**, together with a photocopy of the horse's Flu Vacc certificate. The photocopy should be legible and include all details (i.e. front, back, middle, sides and all other parts of the form.).

There are two main requirements for members wishing to take part in the above competitions.

1. The horse must be owned by a club member or a documented long term lease agreement be in existence.
2. The horse must have valid up to date Flu Vaccination Certificate which must comply in every respect to the rules shown below.

The team selection policy is as follows:

On the basis of the response of the Team forms, a decision is made about how many teams are entered. Selection for team places is based on performance at club competitions or other known events.

It is normally the case that, subject to eligibility, anyone keen to take part will be offered a team place.

If you think you would like to have a go but are not sure then ring Sam for a chat. Otherwise, even if you stated on your membership application that you were interested in teams, please fill in and return your form.

The club pays all Entry Fees to Area competitions.

Equine Influenza - Valid Certificates – Vaccination procedures

Each horse must have a valid vaccination certificate, which undeniably relates to that horse, completed, **signed and stamped** on each line by a veterinary surgeon, who is not the owner of the animal. It must state that the horse has two injections for primary vaccination against Equine Influenza given no less than 21 days and no more than 92 days apart. (Only these two injections need to have been given for the horse to compete). In addition a first booster injection must be given no less than 150 days and no more than 215 days after the second injection of the primary vaccination. Subsequently, booster injections must be given at intervals of not more than 1 year apart, commencing after the first booster injection. None of these injection must have been given within the preceding 7 days, including the day of the competition or entry into competition stables.

Horses foaled before 1st January 1980 need not have had the first booster injection (no less 150 days and no more than 215 days) after the second injection of the primary vaccination – but must have had an annual booster (given within 12 months) thereafter.

Amanda Sutton – Animal Physiotherapist Talk – Red Lion, Thursday June 21st 2001

A beautiful evening awaited those who turned out for Amanda's talk Thursday evening. For reasons unknown turn out was rather poor, but for the 18 or so who did turn up, the evening was well worth the trip to the Red Lion.

Amanda's introduction had us interested right from the start, her training and experiences serve her well, and she gave us lots of recent examples of case studies she has dealt with. Most importantly Amanda's talk was aimed at all horse owners/riders – regardless of competition level.

She then showed us a video talking us through exactly what the Physio's look for when seeing a client's horse for the first time. Amanda explained the detail they go into, to obtain relevant information to find out why a horse may be suffering, and how they would go on and treat the horse.

Amanda's natural public speaking skills enabled us to take on board her findings. She explained things in a way that made them very easy to understand because a lot of them were, at the end of the day, 'common sense'.

We came away from the evening eager to become better judges of our horse's comfort. Many of us took the opportunity to purchase Amanda's book THE INJURY-FREE HORSE which aims to give us the confidence to take an active role in keeping our horses healthy. All in all an excellent evening – I'm glad I didn't miss it!

Word Search Puzzle

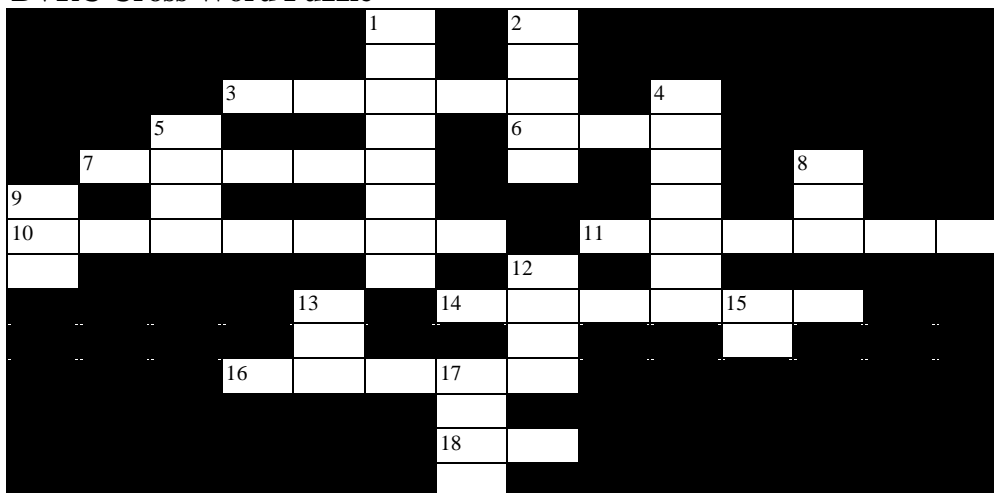

- 3 Refers to the convex shape of a horse's nose
- 6 Hocks are closer together than the feet and the toes point outward: --- hocked.
- 7 A bend, or concavity, in the surface of the hoof wall, usually at the sides
- 10 Area of the horses spin where the neck and back join
- 11 A spot behind the elbow and about 2/3 distance down from the topline of the back: ----- of gravity
- 14 Area of the hind leg between the hock and the stifle joints
- 16 Relationship between the dorsal wall of the hoof & the ground which is measured at the toe with a hoof protractor.
- 18 Medial-lateral

- 1 A matching of two body parts on opposite sides of a horse
- 2 A conformation defect in which the cannon is slightly to the outside of, rather than directly below, the forearm at the knee.
- 4 Neck with a concave topline
- 5 The croup is generally round in quarter horses and ---- in Arabians
- 8 Conformation defect in which a horse's foot points outward: toed ---
- 9 Age at which all molars and temporary incisors are in place.
- 12 A horse that is wider at the chest than at the hooves is ---- narrow.
- 13 A hoof with very low heel angle is said to be --- under.
- 15 Pigeon toed or toed -
- 17 The entire equine appendage, from the scapula or hip down.
