BVRC AGM Report – by Lindsay Devine

Every seat was filled in The Red Lion's function room for the BVRC 2002 AGM held on Wednesday 20th November. Three brave men gave an equal opportunities aspect to the meeting. If an incentive was needed to turn out after a busy day, it was provided by the excellent waiter service at the pub. Throughout the meeting, providing useful pauses in the sometimes heated debate, plates of hot food appeared at the door to sustain those who had not managed to eat before they came. Such busy lives we lead - trouble was, those who had, had more!!!. There was plenty of tea and coffee on the side to keep our concentration levels up once the bar had been vacated, so no reason to doze off in the warm. Dozing off was not on the agenda, however, it proved to be a lively and formative meeting.

A vote of good wishes was sent to Sam Hart, our President, who was in hospital with a chest complaint. His absence was particularly noted as this was probably the first AGM he had missed since the Club's inception in 1966. Lindsay remarked that he had been chairman for a remarkable 13 years – remarkable given his comment before taking on the BVRC that, 'Only fools rode in circles'!

Our top table committee of chairman Lindsay, secretary Sandra and treasurer Brenda kept to the usual agenda items required by AGM rules, first the routine apologies, adoption of previous minutes and matters arising.

Chairman's Report Lindsay's usual entertaining report themed that 2002 had been a difficult year from an organisational point of view, with the new committee learning their craft on the job and, with changes of venue or timing for almost every event from previous years, no act to follow. Nevertheless, all events ran smoothly, with the novices gaining their clear round organisational rosettes!

Her first decade (her words, not mine – ever the decisive executive!) as Chairman had seen the club grow and mature whilst still keeping its' informal feel which many comment on every year – BVRC is a friendly place to be with room for the first-timer and the seasoned competitor. The website had proved a successful innovation with schedules available and newsletters being e-mailed out to members, both of which saved time and money. There had been plenty of help throughout the year from a wide range of members, which was reflected in the extra rosettes presented for the Caballine competition. Safety must always be a priority, which was borne out by the 'West Woodhay incident'.

The Le Trec event had not materialised due to lack of available facilities at the chosen venue. It also required a massive amount of effort in terms of resources by the organisers, there could be more judges than competitors if the recent New Forest RC event was anything to go by; this was an unaffiliated event and attracted ten pairs and six individuals. The BVRC teams did as well as ever, with the Open Show Jumping team reaching the National Championships, although the year had been marred by a very few

team members who pulled out at the last stages, and thus missing out on a once-in-a-lifetime opportunity to compete at national level – indeed the Olympics of the riding Club world. Instruction had been taken up by many, and a new XC schooling venue at Tytherington near Warminster had been booked.

Money Matters The accounts were in a healthy state; new caravans were on the wish list for 2003; it was hoped to acquire a roadshow-type trailer rather than caravans – any information or leads would be gratefully received. Investment would also be made in new jumps to replace the few jumps that were degrading. RC affiliation subscriptions were high as we had so many members. Subscriptions were raised to reflect the rise in British Riding Club's levy of £1.

Election of Committee Members. Brenda stood down as Treasurer but remained on the committee; Rosie Mathias stood unopposed in her stead. Lindsay stood unopposed as Chairman and was re-elected (for another decade I'm sure) to warm applause, which she accepted with her usual grace. The remaining four vacancies on the committee were filled.

Any Other Business. The National Riding Club's conference held recently, discussed horse passports; it will be a legal requirement for every horse to have one from 1st January 2004, at a cost of around £22 . They will be supplied through the BHS with a discount for RC members. Passports held for breeding animals would suffice for those who had them already. It was felt by the meeting that the dressage competitions with extended arenas were a good thing and gave more space to perform tests. Medium tests could be aspired to!

More frequent newsletters were requested; this would be discussed in committee.

The issue of whether BVRC Showjumping and Dressage competitions should be restricting entries in the lower heights and tests by horses with BSJA points and prize money was explored. After much animated discussion, it was carried by a large majority that restrictions should be placed on horse and rider combinations. This did not address the situation of combinations competing at the same level for many seasons – there may be genuine reasons for this, but some members may need to be 'encouraged' to progress leaving the novice classes to the less experienced. The committee would continue the discussion.

Alison of the HORSE BOX shop in Quarley, reminded us that a generous 10% discount applied for BVRC members. Use it or lose it!!!! Carol Glover informed us that Castle Farm would no longer be available as a venue for competitions, although instruction would still go ahead as usual. The farm had changed from dairy to arable so the fields had been ploughed. She was thanked for all her generosity in the past.

Presentations

The Be Fair and Caballine trophies and rosettes were awarded. In addition, Brenda was awarded honorary membership in thanks for all her efforts over the years as Treasurer. Carol Tennick and Sam Mawer were presented with gifts as outgoing Committee members. Sandra thanked Lindsay for her indefatigable efforts as our Chairman and presented a bouquet on our behalf.

Be Fair Cup and Caballine Trophy

The Be Fair Cup and Caballine Trophy are presented annually at the AGM.

Be Fair points are awarded to the 6 highest placed BV members in every competition regardless of their overall places (they may be 10th in the class but 2nd best BV member). Riders are only eligible for points on one horse on any particular day. Members who compete in teams on behalf of the BVRC will receive three points per day.

The Caballine Trophy points are awarded on a point for each hour or part hour worked at a show or setting up the day before a show. Committee members who organise the events only get points on this basis and not for other committee duties. Even so, the top places do seem to be filled by them. A rose bowl is awarded to the highest placed non-committee member.

In addition to the trophies, rosettes are presented to the top ten places in each competition. Each Trophy winner is awarded free membership for the following year.

Rule Reminder

The club doesn't have too many rules, but just as a general reminder to keep everyone on the straight and narrow here are details of the ones that seem to cause most problems.

BVRC membership is open to people 17 years old or older (with no upper age limit). 16 year olds may compete in competitions and attend any riding event as a member's guest, (with permission of the organiser) but BVRC does not allow under 16's to ride at their events. They do however, welcome guests of any age at their socials.

Anyone riding at our events MUST wear correct approved headgear. The current standard is **at least to the recommended standards PAS015 or EN1384; hats prefixed SEI or ASTM are permissible (ASTM is not valid on its own, it must have the SEI prefix)**. Hats shall have a chin strap which has a non-detachable retaining harness secured to the shell at more than two points. Hats marked EN1384, PAS015 or prefixed ASTM or SEI are the minimum standard allowed. Hard Hats to specification PAS015 or ASTM F1163 are considered to offer greater protection than EN1384. Recommended hats should carry the quality assurance stamp of Kitemark or SEI. American standard SNELL E95 and Australian or New Zealand standard SNZ 3838 1998 are also acceptable. Where a hat is of skullcap style, this must be worn with a silk, which may be coloured for cross country. Such headgear shall be worn properly adjusted and fastened at all times when mounted.

Bit unflattering perhaps, but we are not insured if we allow people to ride in incorrect headgear, so please be aware before you turn up and bring the right hat with you.

Body protectors (Class 3 - Purple Label) shall be worn for any event involving cross country jumping and are strongly recommended for show jumping.

Otherwise there is no particular dress code, it is sufficient just to be "clean and tidy". Correct footwear (i.e. no Muckers) is a good idea. Jewellery lovers please note, for safety reasons it is not permissible to wear earrings whilst competing. Not even studs.

A new rule for BRC competitions was been introduced last year and states '*long hair should be worn in a net or secured in such way as not to hang below the collar for safety reasons*'.

Please Note: Medical armbands (armbands issued by BE and BRC are acceptable) will be mandatory at Club One Day event and Hunter Trial competitions this year.

Area 17 Novice Indoor Show Jumping Qualifier at Kingston Maurward, Nr Dorchester on Sunday 30th March, 2003.

This is an early call for the first of the Area 17 qualifying competitions for 2003. Teams of four riders compete over two rounds, with jumps 2'6" and 2'9" in each round. The team total is made up from the best three scores in each round. The competition is at Kingston Maurward, Nr Dorchester. Horses with any BSJA winnings or BE points are ineligible.

If you are interested in being part of a team please fill in and return the attached form to Paula Mitchell (01794 301104) by the Friday 28th February. We need to decide by the 1st March how many teams to enter. Please remember that you will need to have a fully up to date flu certificate (for your horse).

Please Note: riders may only compete for one club in any competition year.

The team selection policy is as follows:

On the basis of the response of the Team forms, a decision is made about how many teams are entered. Selection for team places is based on performance at club competitions or other known events.

It is normally the case that, subject to eligibility, anyone keen to take part will be offered a team place.

If you think you would like to have a go but are not sure then ring Paula (01794 301104) for a chat. Otherwise, even if you stated on your membership application that you were interested in teams, please fill in and return your form.

The club pays all Entry Fees to Area competitions.

Equine Influenza - Valid Certificates – Vaccination procedures

Each horse must have a valid vaccination certificate, which undeniably relates to that horse, completed, **signed and stamped** on each line by a veterinary surgeon, who is not the owner of the animal. It must state that the horse has two injections for primary vaccination against Equine Influenza given no less than 21 days and no more than 92 days apart. (Only these two injections need to have been given for the horse to compete). In addition a first booster injection must be given no less than 150 days and no more than 215 days after the second injection of the primary vaccination. Subsequently, booster injections must be given at intervals of not more than 1 year apart, commencing after the first booster injection. **None of these injections must have been given within the preceding 7 days**, including the day of the competition or entry into competition stables.

Horses foaled before 1st January 1980 need not have had the first booster injection (no less 150 days and no more than 215 days) after the second injection of the primary vaccination – but must have had an annual booster (given within 12 months) thereafter.

Instruction

Weekday instruction with Diana Burgess has been organised at Castle Farm, Over Wallop, weekend sessions with Elizabeth Peerless at Castle Farm and evening and weekend sessions with Sorrel Warwick at Cholderton House EC. Two Cross Country Instruction dates have been arranged at the newly opened Downlands EC, Tytherington, Heytsbury, Nr Warminster. Downlands EC boasts to having in excess of 100 XC fences ranging from 2'-3'6" which includes a superb water complex.

For anyone attending the XC sessions please note that a disclaimer must be signed before accessing the XC Course. Venue maps are available on request. Please abide by the 10mph speed limit approaching the EC.

If there is more than 1 group, please ring 2 days beforehand to find out to which group you have been allocated.

PLEASE NOTE: At the time of writing the road through Cholderton is closed by floodwater. It is imperative that you check Sorrel's sessions are going ahead by ringing Lindsay.
