The May / June period has always been the busiest in our calendar. This year proved no exception, with three shows run over four consecutive weekends, breaking only for the Queen's Jubilee celebrations. We are now having a little breather before embarking on the next round of club and inter club team qualifying competitions. We are able to make full use of our show jumps running two lots of Show Jumping instruction, evening Clear Round Jumping, a Show Jumping course walk and rounding off with the annual Show Jumping competition. Cross Country schooling has been organised on two dates in preparation for the area horse trials qualifier, although the sessions are open to all. LKH.

Area 17 Novice and Open Team Show Jumping Qualifiers at Langford Farm, Nr Soton, 16th June

We received enough interest for this qualifier to enable us to enter 1 Novice and 1 Open team. Unfortunately, due to the constant deluge of rain over the past month, the competition was postponed until the middle of August.

Clear Round Jumping at Blackburn Farm, Grateley on Wednesday 3rd July 6pm

As we will be setting our jumps for the Show Jumping on 7th July, we decided that we would run a Clear Round Jumping evening. Jump heights will be set to suit but please try to come early if you want low jumps and slightly later for larger fences. Cost £2.50 per round, £6 for three rounds. (pay as you go).

Directions: Blackburn Farm is situated on the Grateley side of Over Wallop on the B3084 and is 1 mile North West of the A343 Andover / Salisbury Road at the Middle Wallop junction and 4 miles South East of the A303 / A338 junction near Cholderton. The venue will be signed 'BVRC' from the B3084 Grateley / Over Wallop road.

Show Jumping Course Walk with Elizabeth Peerless at Blackburn Farm, Grateley on Wednesday 3rd July 6.30 & 7.30pm.

In conjunction with the Clear Round Jumping, we have organised two course walks with Elizabeth at 6.30pm & 7.30pm. Come and get some tips to enhance your chances of jumping a clear round. Free to members, £2 for non-members.

We are holding our annual Show Jumping Show at Blackburn Farm again this year. The schedule includes the usual four classes ranging in height from 2'3" to 3'3". British Riding Clubs (BRC) European Rural Riders Championships 3rd -7th July at Hartbury College.

BRC welcome the rest of Europe to Hartbury College (Nr Gloucester) for the Rural Riders Championships for nations where team members are also members of Riding Clubs. The competition is a special format three day event for national teams. This unique event not only has individual Dressage, Cross Country and Show Jumping phases, but starts with a team Dressage phase where all six team members ride as a team, in the same arena at the same time, which makes for a great spectacle. This will be the biggest event the BRC has ever organised and is unlikely to be staged in this country for years to come. Dressage Competition at West Woodhay (Nr Newbury) on Sunday 28th July. (Schedule enclosed)

Special Open 3 Day Event at National Horse Trials Championships at Offchurch Bury, Nr Leamington Spa, 9-11th August

This is an individual competition open to Riders who have attained 5 clear rounds at BE novice level or BRC open level and horses with not more than 60 BE/IHTS points. The course height for Show Jumping is 3'9"-3'11" and Cross Country 3'9" with steeplechase at 3'6". Entries are restricted to two from each Area. If anyone is interested in taking part in this competition please ring Lindsay (01264 772388) so that names can be added to the Area 17 list of applicants for entry.

Alfred's Tower Team Endurance Challenge on 25th August.

This is a 30Km (18 mile) ride with the intention of giving Riding Club members a taste of endurance riding with a lot of fun thrown in for good measure. The event will be held as part of Endurance GB's Alfred's Tower Ride at Sommerslade Down, Nr Warminster, Wilts. The route has to be ridden at between 9.6 and 12.8Kph (6 to 8 miles per hour), with a speed of 11.2Kph (7Mph) gaining most points. At the finish the horse must be sound and those with lower heart rate are awarded the higher scores. Any reasonably fit horse should be able to cope with 30km quite easily just by increasing the distance and speed of ordinary hacks by a few kilometres for about 6 weeks prior to the ride.

The route is a mixture of terrain but with lots of good going over open hills, forest tracks and green lanes. Roadwork has been kept to a minimum; about four kilometres on this route. In favourable weather there are fantastic views across the Deverall Hills, Alfred's Tower can be seen from almost every part of the route including the venue.

Area 17 Novice Hunter Trials Team Qualifier on Sunday 7th April at Dene Farm, Nether Wallop

We received ample interest in this competition enabling us to enter two teams plus one individual. On the day, our individual entry, understandably, decided not to risk her horse on the hard ground, and unfortunately, one team member's horse had azoturia that morning so obviously could not take part. Thankfully he is fine now.

So we started with one team of four comprising Jessica Kingsley-Jones, Shani Jukhental, Sarah Butler & Vanessa Martin, and a team of three: Vanessa Boakes, Josie Coleman & Lorraine Storer. The first team only had one refusal between them, and with the best three scores to count finished on a zero score which was a great result. Poor Vanessa (Boakes) and Josie were eliminated, but Lorraine had a fantastic clear finishing within 3 seconds of the optimum time.

The team was one of three on a zero score, and when time was taken into account were placed third (from fourteen teams). The first two teams, IOW and Hampshire Rural RC, qualified for the National Championships at Peterborough. Vanessa Martin came 6th individually and Lorraine won! She also qualified for the National Championships.

National Hunter Trial Championship at Peterborough on Sunday 12th May

Our Open Hunter Trial team qualified for the Championships on 4th November last year, a long time for the team to remain intact.

The Championship is open to the original qualifying team plus two named reserves. As one horse was sold early in the year, one of the name reserves was substituted at the entry stage. Another team member had a fall, injuring both horse and rider, so they were unable to take up their place. The remaining reserve was unable to fill the vacant slot, leaving a team of three to travel to Peterborough. At the last minute, another team member was required to work over the weekend. The remainder didn't consider it was worthwhile travelling to the Championships in order to compete as an individual.

Lorraine Storer with As Good as Gold stabled overnight near Peterborough in order to take her place in the Novice Hunter Trial Championships. Sandra & I drove up on Sunday morning to support Lorraine and experience the Championships, in person, for the first time. We had driven through bright sunshine to within 1 mile of the course where the weather descended into foggy cloud which didn't lift until mid-morning. Conditions on the course were perfect - bright sunny warm weather with dry ground. The course was set between two hilltops and traversed the river crossing in the valley between them four times, each with increasing difficulty. The four trips down one hill and up the other side demanded a high level of fitness for horse and rider.

Somewhat delayed from her original start time, Lorraine duly set off very purposefully. Half way around the course she looked to be going well. After descending the steep hill at some speed, she steadied her horse to negotiate the third river crossing, a narrow log diagonally across the stream set in a gully. The horse decided that this all needed closer inspection and ground to a stop, only to jump it without any fuss at the second attempt. They continued their round without further incident, including the last river crossing which entailed a steep drop into water, followed by a jump in the middle river, which they accomplished with some style.

Lorraine waited to find the time of her round for which she received 7 time penalties (within 21 seconds of the optimum) indicating that, without a watch, her judgement of pace had been extremely accurate, but leaving her feeling what might have been. Well done to Lorraine and As Good As Gold for their achievement.

The Isle of Wight Novice team, representing Area 17, finished an excellent fourth in team competition. Congratulations to them. A Horse & Hound report said that while awaiting the results the IOW had been anxious about catching the last ferry back to the island. This seems somewhat surprising as the class finished by 1.30pm, until you hear that results were not forthcoming until 4.30pm! Many thanks to Sam Mawer for organising entries, substitutions, stabling, cancellations and all the many letters and phone calls that entailed.

One Day Event at Knighton Down, Larkhill on Sunday 19th May, 2002.

It doesn't matter how many times we organise this competition and how prepared we try to be, there is always the unexpected waiting to catch us out.

Entries started to roll in a soon as the schedules were sent out, six weeks before the competition. Early indications, based on the over subscription of the Hunter Trial and rapid response to the schedule distribution, were that this event too would be oversubscribed. Unfortunately, the usual late rush of entries didn't materialise, leaving enough to make it a worthwhile competition without being over stretched.

The week leading up to the event is always frantic – finalising the XC courses, distances and times; allocating fence judges to fences, ringing around to try to get more volunteers; allocating competitor times; confirming times and Dressage tests with judges; arranging towing of jump trailers / caravans; sorting helpers to set up / pack up; sorting out scoring material, running order lists for all phases and copies for fence judges; sorting out XC maps and printing copies for display and for fence judges; printing master scoreboards.

After giving out competitor times on Thursday evening, I set off on Friday to meet the XC course builder and do a final check on the XC courses, feeling that most things were reasonable well in order. As we set off around the course, the course builder said "I've put an extra fence in the Novice for you". This was met with a stunned silence! Further course inspections revealed a complete change of routes through the water complex, and a fence intended to be A&B, numbered as two separate fences, for sound technical reasons, of course. There seemed no alternative but to go home and redraw all the maps and reprint some of the scoring material. Before embarking on this task, I had arranged to meet the jump trailer towers and unpack some of the jumps ready for the

SJ course builder's arrival the following morning. Initially, only two of the convoy arrived, and when I enquired as to Carol's whereabouts, I was told she was coming with a tractor. I thought this was a good joke and was duly amazed when Carol did in fact appear in an extremely large tractor towing a jump trailer, having made her way from Over Wallop via Bulford to Larkhill. On arrival home I discovered that one of the Dressage judges wasn't coming on Sunday because she had to work. After much phoning to find a last minute replacement, Liz Potter very magnanimously agreed to do the job herself. Although this solved one problem, it presented another because Liz was to do the Dressage scoring – more phone calls!

Setting up on Saturday morning went quite smoothly thanks to the number of helpers who turned up. Just as well with five dressage arenas, a show jumping arena, fences and a small marquis to put up. The final, final check on the XC course showed that the bank was still incorrectly flagged and I had to resort to hammer and staples to correct matters, clouting myself on the head with a red flag in process.

I arrived home around 2pm feeling again that things were under control and we were set for a good day. At 4pm I received a frantic phone call from drenched, wind swept Sandra at Larkhill, to say that the marquis had blown some distance away and in the process the frame had bent and to was impossible to replace to cover, and "What should she do?". There was no alternative but to abandon the marquis and seek alternative accommodation for the team of scorers – more phone calls.

The event day dawned dry but the forecast was not too promising. Early arrivals, speculating on the day's weather, fell distinctly into two camps of "bottle half full / bottle half empty" – it's great we are going to have a good day / the forecast isn't very good, we are going to get a soaking. Luckily the former group were correct and we remained dry all day.

The competition itself provided very little to comment over. The ambulance, doctor and vet didn't leave their posts all day. It all ran like clockwork and to time in all phases with results out in record time. This was all the more remarkable because several new comers were responsible for different aspects of the day and this included 75% of the scoring team who had never done the job previously.

It was pleasing to note that one third of the competitors were club members enabling BV members to fill one complete section of the intermediate class.

Re-enforcements arrived late afternoon to do the clearing up and by the time all rosettes had been distributed there was no sign we had been there at all. That is, apart from Susie's lorry, used to house the scorers, which refused to start. Having had several earlier problems with it, Susie threatened to paint a target on it and leave it in-situ, to the mercy of the army.

Many thanks and well done to everyone involved for making this an extremely successful day.
