Hunter Trial at Dene Farm, Nether Wallop on Sunday 20th October

Insufficient entries meant it was not viable to run the Hunter Trial, either financially or in terms of the proportion of helpers to competitors.

Cancellation was a great disappointment after running very successful events for the past few years, more particularly after last year when we were turning entries away. The move from Larkhill was a big blow, but the popular Dene Farm, should have provided an excellent alternative. In an attempt to avoid the early onset of darkness we have experienced in recent years by running the event after the clocks had changed, we tried to occupy an earlier slot. A clash with other events may have been our downfall or perhaps the concrete ground resulting from an extensive dry period proved the deterrent.

Comments were received that our entry fees were too high. Any event involving Cross Country jumping is expensive to run. The course costs themselves constitute less than half the total expenditure. The responsibility of running without extensive safety measures is too great. We will not run without a Doctor, Paramedic Ambulance and Vet in attendance on site. Every fence needs two people, issued with a radio, to judge. Then there should be enough manpower to deal with any situation and give rapid incident reporting.

In addition, we like to look after our fence judges, we want them to help us again. We ask Jill Vallis to provide everyone with excellent lunches and to visit each fence during the morning and afternoon to say thank you and dispense cake and drinks.

Needless to say all this costs money. Entry fees are set accordingly, but even so it needs between 120 to 150 entries just to break even.

When I attend other events and see one person alone covering two or three fences and radios a rare commodity, I wonder if we do go over the top. I only have to consider what might happen to know that I am unwilling to be responsible for an event without stringent safety measures in place. I would not want to be in the position of knowing veterinary or medical help is needed and not instantly available.

Many thanks go to all the people who had volunteered to help on the day. Apologies are sent to anyone that we didn't speak to personally to let them know of the cancellation.

National Riding Club Championships at Lincoln on Saturday 14th September

The prospect of undertaking the long trip to Lincoln to contest the National BRC Open Team Show Jumping Championships was exciting, a bit daunting initially, but the qualifying team members were very keen. It would be a unique experience at the first run Championships at Lincoln. After contributing to the team qualification, teaching commitments and Amport Riding Centre's end of season Show prevented Richard Hale with Dream Foxtrot from taking their place on the day. Able replacements were found in Lynn Elliott and Wallace, who were pleased to be given the opportunity to represent the club.

After a little hiccup over which horses Jess and Howard had ridden in qualification and which they wanted to partner at the Championships, stabling was booked and we were all set and raring to go.

The horses and riders set off during Friday afternoon and after a long, but not difficult, drive of around 5 hours, arrived in plenty of time to get settled in for the night. The foot followers, Sandra, Sam & I left home, in the dark, at 5.30am to ensure we were there in time to see Jess jump at 9.15am. We arrived at the magnificent Lincolnshire Showground with an hour to spare - well enough time to find the team, have a loo break, get our bearings and find the Open Show Jumping Arena. I hadn't appreciated how just how flat the area was. It was an awesome sight entering the show ground, a sea of dressage boards extended into the distance. Four show jumping arenas were boarded by thick privet hedges and the whole area was neatly mown old turf.

We were very privileged to be allowed to use the main show jumping ring, which was saved for special occasions. The day fulfilled its early promise with an excellent, closely fought competition. Our team held their own against strong opposition. The course was set at the maximum height of 3'6", with maximum spread, and maximum number of fences and distance. With the first members of each team jumping, followed by the second members and so on, Jess got us off to a great start, jumping a clear round over the challenging course. The partnership was unlucky to pick up an unexpected time penalty, incurred because they were less than 1 second over the time allowed. Sarah followed with just one fence down and Lynn jumped an immaculate clear round. Howard was unable to improve on the earlier rounds, so with the best three scores to count towards a team total we finished the first round on a total of 5 penalties in sixth place. Of the twenty teams participating, three teams finished on a zero score and two others had four faults.

We embarked on the second round knowing that there was still all to play for. The course was changed, raised by 3" in height, and included a double and treble to a related distance fence on a homeward run to the collecting ring. Jess set off, determined not to repeat her earlier time penalty, and jumped a stylish clear round. Sarah maintained her form and jumped a confident round, again with just one fence down. This was a good score as it was becoming apparent that poles were falling and faults readily accrued. Information about team scores was not forthcoming from the commentators so it was unclear as to how we were faring compared to the other teams. Lynn's round was not as successful as the first with two fences down and a stop. Again, Howard, not given much assistance by his horse, was not able to improve the team score. Still it was unclear whether we were in the rosettes or not.

Eventually the results were announced. Mount Mascal had won on a 4 fault total with South Western Dressage Group second on 8 faults. Both teams added no penalties in the second round and finished on their first round totals.

Golden Valley added 8 faults to their first round zero score and were given third place on their second round times. 4 faults separated the next three teams. To our surprise and delight our team total of 21 faults had given us seventh place, rosettes being presented to the top ten teams and individuals. Jess wasn't so lucky individually. With ten double clears jumping off for the ten place rosettes, Jess's one penalty put her in eleventh place.

It had been an excellent day, dry but very cold as the winds whipped across the Lincolnshire plains. Jess, Sarah, Lynn & Howard had acquitted themselves admirably. We were very proud to see them receive their, well deserved, rosettes.

We embarked on our homeward journey knowing that the M1 was closed on the section we wanted to use. Some masterly navigation by Sam, steered us through the centre of Leicester and from there back to our original route home. Queued up in the centre of Leicester, we discovered from the local radio station, that we M1 had been closed in both directions for six hours because a man had threatened to jump off one of the bridges. We learnt he had been dissuaded from jumping and the M1 was reopened just as we crossed it to get onto the M69.

It had been an eventful day, but one that we will all remember for a long time.
