In November 2003 we booked to use the Hunter Trial course at Larkhill for our autumn event, and paid a £75 deposit for the privilege. English Nature struck again and decided they were closing the course from the beginning of October so we couldn't use it. Despite explanation of costs already incurred, reasoning and pleading, it all fell on deaf ears and they were unmoved. Luckily for us Nigel & Juliette Pond were more sympathetic and kindly agreed to let us return to Dene Farm, keeping our original date on October 31<sup>st</sup>. It is very fortunate that we have an alternative venue in the area.

Great news for Area 17 clubs has come from the British Riding Clubs National Championships held on 11<sup>th</sup> September. Chilworth RC won the Open Dressage Team competition with Maria Hoare, Sarah Loveday-Lovell, Vanessa Nicolls and Cassie Scaife. This was an exceptional result with Sarah and Vanessa winning in their arenas, Cassie second in her arena and Maria in fourth place, becoming the discarded score.

This was followed up by the IOW RC who won the new Intermediate Show Jumping Team competition. Their team comprised Lucy Vale, Susan Holmes, Alison Lord and Helen Furnell. Susan was also an arena winner in the Individual Open Dressage. Several other teams and individuals from Area 17 were in the ribbons.

#### **Novice Show & Riding Club Horse Competition on Saturday 25<sup>th</sup> September at Ampport Riding Centre 1pm.** (Schedule posted earlier.)

Due to the popularity of the Novice Show in April we are doing a repeat performance towards the end of September. Included in with show is the Riding Club Horse competition. Although originally run on its own, latterly the competition was run with the Combined Training in May. With increased entries at the CT show it all got a bit complicated, hence the reason for introducing it again in September. The Novice Show is designed to be a relaxed low key event aimed at the true novice rider or horse, not usually brave enough or experienced enough to be in contention at our normal shows. Please respect this intent when entering and ensure eligibility for the classes entered. HC entries are welcome from those not strictly eligible, but want to come for the experience. The Riding Club Horse competition is open to all. We hope to see you on the day.

All the General instruction sessions consist of some flatwork with some optional gridwork or a small course of jumps at the end. Each session will last 1½ hours.

Cross country instruction has been organised at Downlands EC, Tytherington, Heytsbury, Nr Warminster. Sessions will also last for 1½ hours. Body protectors are compulsory.

For anyone attending the XC session at Downlands please note that a disclaimer must be signed before accessing the XC Course. Venue directions are available on request. Please abide by the 10mph speed limit approaching the EC.

**BRC National Horse Trials Championships at Offchurch Bury, Nr Leamington Spa on 6<sup>th</sup>, 7<sup>th</sup> & 8<sup>th</sup> August**

*With less than three weeks between the qualifier and the trip to Offchurch it was action stations to get entries in, stables booked, transport and accommodation organised and information regarding the competition and all aspects of the four day stay at Offchurch dispensed to the participants. The open qualifiers, Tacita Rolls and Kilmartin Jimmy, Kati Cuthbertson and Mr McDuff, Justin Clubleby with Mystic Vision (Josh - team horse) and Winnower (individual) were to be joined by Karen Baxter and Maytrix, whilst Sarah Peerless and Folkin Philomel (Milly) were our representative in the Novice competition. The Open Championships was being run as a 3 day event and the Novice a 2 day. It soon became clear that the Open team members needed to travel on Thursday 5<sup>th</sup> so that they were ready for their 9am, pre-event, vet's inspection on Friday morning.*

*Thunder, lightening and torrential rain had been the overnight pattern in the days leading up to the event but the warm days had rendered perfect going. The polo ground was an idyllic setting for the dressage. In the heat of the day, with very little breeze, the Open competitors rode the new BRC Horse Trials dressage test in a long arena. With six arenas in action, four for the team members and two individuals, each person rode in a different arena producing some excellent tests.*

*On Saturday morning, accompanied by Sandra and Rosie, our early arrival gave us time to walk the Open & Novice Cross Country courses before the action started. We felt very privileged to be able to walk in the parkland of Offchurch House, with the heat of the sun burning off the early morning mist.*

*Sarah's Novice dressage and Show Jumping were taking place before the Open started their roads and tracks. We made our way to the polo ground to watch Sarah and Milly perform. We were not disappointed, the performance in the long arena was a joy to watch, making everything look easy. Milly looks like a push button performer, but I know from his antics with a previous replacement jockey, who nearly got bucked off warming up for dressage, that rider skills are essential to curb his school boy pranks. He and Sarah looked a picture and their performance belied their diminutive figures.*

*We had time to catch up with the Open riders who were nervously preparing for their roads and tracks, steeplechase and cross country. None had ever done a 2 or 3 day event before, and with the dimension and complexity of the cross country, well up to BE Novice standard, were embarking on the most difficult test of their lives with some trepidation. We re-assured them that we would be available to help in the 10 minute box, prior to the cross country start, and wished them well.*

*Next we walked to the Show Jumping arena set with Offchurch House as its backdrop. We had time to peruse the dressage scores and found to our delight that Karen was in the lead in her arena, and Justin with Josh second placed in his. The rider ahead of him had an unbelievable 17.1 penalties. The other three scores, within a mark of each other, left the team handily placed for what was to be an exciting cross country day.*

*We watched Sarah and Milly put in an immaculate show jumping round. Milly, delighted to be jumping after a four year absence, gave the fences plenty of air but jumped carefully to add nothing to his dressage score. Later in the day we discovered that he was lying second in his section, well in contention and ready for the challenge of the roads and tracks, steeplechase and cross country the following day.*

We turned our attention to the Open riders. Armed with lists of times of who was doing what at which time, and a master plan to help where necessary and maximize our viewing possibilities, we had to be on our toes. We viewed Tacita on the steeplechase from across the river and then prepared for her arrival in the 10 minute box. With buckets of water, grease, a stud box and essential tack replacement lined up, we had our designated jobs to assist Julia in getting horse and rider prepared for the cross country. Once Tacita was back in the saddle, with 2 minutes to go, we ran like mad uphill to get in position near fence four. From there we could view the first four fences and were well placed to run on to catch sight of a group of five fences which included the second water crossing. From there we could run again and see the sunken road complex, three fences from home.

Tacita flew the first four fences, the fourth being particularly wide and off a turn. We heard on the PA that after clearing the first water crossing Jimmy had run out at a very narrow brush on an uphill run from a huge step out of water. She came back into our view jumping fluently and made little of the rest of the course.

We ran back, just missing Justin & Winnie's steeplechase, but in time to see Kati (a jockey) give an exhibition of steeplechase riding. Justin & Kati followed each other into the 10 minute box, so there were two to prepare. This time we were assisting both Vanessas and Toby, but there were enough of us to do the necessary jobs. With both riders back in the saddle, we repeated the earlier exercise and ran like hell. Justin & Winnie followed Tacita's example and ran out at the same fence but completed the rest of the course without incident and in good time. Kati and Duffy had a bit of a fright over the width of fence four and so stopped at the next fence, a roll top before the first water. Clearing the fence at the second attempt, they had no problem at either the water or the brush following. With confidence still low, Duffy had a second stop at set of rails. Watching, I wondered if this was the end of the road as there were several difficult combinations still ahead. Kati had other ideas, and with some strong riding completed the course in fine style, Duffy gaining confidence the further he went. Kati assured me before she set off that she would be taking the long route at the sunken road, so I was surprised to see her take the direct route with great aplomb.

Karen's well judged steeplechase left her with seconds to spare. This time we joined Karen (Karen's friend) in the 10 minute box, and again embarked on dash on to the course. We were hopeful when watching the first four fences, but Karen & May fell foul of the same brush fence. All looked well up to and through the second water crossing, but we heard of a further problem at a corner fence off a turn. Karen reflected later that both faults were unlucky and occurred through the wrong line to fences and not disobedience from May, and she had been very pleased with her round.

Last but not least came Justin with Josh. Justin and Vanessa (Josh's owner) were adamant that, because of his inexperience, Josh wouldn't go through the water and explained Josh had not jumped at all before February. Again we missed Justin's steeplechase, but after the 10 minute box made good time out onto the cross country. Sandra and Rosie decided to go to watch the first water crossing, whilst I stuck to the earlier plan. Again the first four fences looked easy. It was with bated breath we awaited his approach to the water jump. All fears were groundless, he flew the roll top, dropped in and out the water and jumped the troublesome brush fence. Like the others, he negotiated the direct route through rail complex, and riding strongly coaxed Josh through the second water crossing without too much resistance. He stormed around the rest of the cross country, flew the sunken road like a veteran and finished, un-penalised, 14 seconds under the optimum time.

It had been a good day, all five had completed the cross country, and were fit and well. Tacita unfortunately picked up penalties on the first roads and tracks due to a mistake with her times. Penalties were attributable to lack of experience at this level of competition, and not due to lack of ability, guts or determination. We were looking forward to day three.

After another round trip to Andover and back overnight, we were ready for the final day. Sarah was on day 2 – cross country day, and the others, after a vet's check were to show jump. At least we only had one trip onto the cross country.

Sarah & Milly started the steeplechase cautiously, but after the first couple of fences Milly decided that this was fun and he would see how far he could stand off the fences. We did the 10 minute box routine and legged it onto the cross country. The hill hadn't become any smaller overnight. Milly rewarded us with a copybook round, looking like he would be penalised for going much too fast. Realising the problem, Sarah slowed to a walk and managed to finish 2 seconds over the optimum time adding just 0.8 penalties to her dressage score, and not affecting her overnight place as the next placed person was one penalty behind her. Milly had well compensated for the blot on his copybook at his last appearance at the Championships four years earlier.

It was much later in the day before Sarah realised that the rider leading her section had 13 time penalties on the cross country, and she & Milly were promoted to first place, winning her section. This was a remarkable performance. The section comprised of arena winners from all over the country and this was only Sarah's second competition with the pony. We know he has loads of ability, but it needs to be channelled and Sarah's own talent enabled her to get the best from him. Well done.

The Open riders jumped in reverse order, irrespective of team places. Justin & Josh had not managed to overhaul his section leader who remained with just 17.1 penalties, but he was lying second overall.

Tacita started us off with an excellent clear round. New to eventing, show jumping is her forte. Kati with a rather stiff looking Duffy had 2 fences down. This was still an excellent performance on a 3'6" course, which included a treble to finish. Both mares, May & Winnie, looked like they had had enough and just wanted to go home. May's reluctance meant they incurred quite a few faults but managed to complete the course. We wondered if Winnie was actually going to start at all, but once persuaded by Justin she jumped clear until the knocking the last two elements of the treble. Justin and Josh were last but one to jump and completed the round with a single fence down. Pressure was on the last pair to jump. They had two fences in hand but three down meant Justin would win. The pair were determined to keep their unblemished record and completed a faultless round to finish on their dressage score of 17.1, a worthy overall champion.

Justin & Josh retained second place and with Winnie took sixth place in his individual section. By virtue of their excellent dressage, Karen & May took eighth place in her section. The team finished in eleventh place from twenty teams, just out of the ribbons.

Tacita and Kati didn't go home empty handed, they were able to claim commemorative rosettes to mark the occasion.

It was a great weekend and experience for all. The riders are clamouring to repeat the challenge next year – here's hoping!
